## LSC

- LSC should represent population
- Establish a strong working and funded diversity board

## **Participation**

- All clubs in LSC participate in diversity efforts
  - Create 2-3 new clubs in underserved areas
    - Develop quality clubs
    - Clubs in multicultural areas (start with Make a Splash partnerships)

## **Promotion**

- Hold multiple LSC events promoting diversity
- Statewide Make a Splash water safety day/event
  - o Hold water safety month
- Hold regional diversity programs
- Annual spirit camps locally with USA Swimming and non-USA Swimming members

## Reporting

- 30% increase or more in diversity reporting
- Increase the # of registrants checking the box
- Increase/be the best LSC in reporting ethnicities

## Outreach

- Raise outreach by 15% or more
- Bridge High Schools and parks to clubs
- Establish grants for Native American and inner city initiatives
- Establish an outreach membership for underserved groups that can't afford registration fee
- Work with elementary schools to establish a mandatory learn to swim program
- Establish strong relationships with municipalities in your area

- Establish Make a Splash local partners in all states
- Bridge Make a Splash to clubs
- Have the most Make a Splash local partner members

#### **Education**

- Collaborative effort between neighboring LSC's

- Hold swimposium with diversity track
- Hold educational summit with non-USA coaches

- Develop grant programs that will increase membership
- Each year update all policies and procedures for grants
