PVS Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) continues to work towards offering creative programs to support and encourage diversity among PVS clubs, athletes, coaches, parents and volunteers and to discover new ways to serve our community.

2021-2023 DEI Highlights

• PVS Support for the 35th Annual Black History Invitational

- The annual Black History Invitational is regarded by USA Swimming as the premier Diversity, Equity and Inclusion swimming competition in the United States and is a USA Swimming approved competition. PVS is honored to continue hosting this prestigious event for the past 35 years!
- Although many teams couldn't attend the meet this year due to COVID, we still hosted 600 athletes from fifteen (15) different cubs and seven (7) different LSC's (PVS, Maryland, Lake Erie, Georgia, Metro, Middle Atlantic and Allegheny Mountain)!
- Tim Hinchey (USA Swimming President/CEO), Joel Shinofield (USA Swimming Managing Director, Sport Development), MJ Truex (USA Swimming Senior Director, Team Services, Coach & Athlete Development) and Leland Brown (USA Swimming Program Director, DEI) all made the trip out to Washington, DC to support this year's meet! Wade Atkins from the National DEI Committee officiated at the meet and Tim Husson (PVS General Chair) also volunteered. A big thank you to everyone that made this meet a huge success!

• USA Down Syndrome Swimming

- USADSS hosted a National Training Camp for swimmers with Down syndrome in February! The organization added two coaching positions, one of which was offered to Marye Carter from the PVS DEI Committee, and also named Paris Jacobs w/ Machine Aquatics to one of the three board positions. It is an honor to have two amazing PVS members serve on this incredible organization.
- The DEI Committee will continue working with USADSS in an effort to advocate for people with developmental disabilities.

• SWIM UP

In 2019, SWIM UP, Inc. and DC Parks and Recreation partnered with Bishop Walker School for Boys (a tuition-free private school for children from traditionally under-served communities) to provide weekly swim and water safety instruction to students. In January of 2021, SWIM UP implemented the program into the curriculum at The Washington School for Girls. Mary Bergstrom was excited to bring SWIM UP back to Barry Farm pool this season and the PVS DEI Committee was happy to support this program. We will continue to do so and welcome anyone that has the desire to volunteer or support the program in any way possible.

• PVS Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Outreach Grant Program

 PVS awards up to \$5,000 annually to local clubs and members with programs that are aimed at encouraging an underrepresented or marginalized population to learn how to swim or become competitive swimmers. The application will be posted to the PVS website in May. All club teams and its members will be notified when the application is available to fill out.

• New DEI Committee

• An early season request for new DEI Committee members brought in almost forty (40) constituents. The new members have a genuine interest in DEI and most have backgrounds in the field.

PVS DEI Future Events & Programs

- World's Largest Tread-A-Thon
 - The purpose of the World's Largest Tread-A-Thon on May 15 is to celebrate International Water Safety Day. This celebration is a collaborative effort with the International Water Safety Foundation, Diversity in Aquatics, Colin's Hope and Counsilman-Hunsaker to tread and raise funds toward land-based water safety education.

• Summer Tread-A-Thon

• The purpose of the Summer Tread-A-Thon is to encourage participants to become advocates for water safety during the summer months with their teams and organizations. The Summer Tread-A-Thon can take place during the months of June, July and August.

• College Knowledge Seminar – May 2023

 Now that we are (hopefully) through the worst of the pandemic, our goal is to bring back this amazing event next year. The College Knowledge Seminar is hosted by the PVS DEI Committee to provide our swimmers and parents with information regarding the college selection, recruitment and application process.

• High School Swimming Outreach Program

 Sophie Elliott (National DEI Committee/PVS Athlete Rep) is working with PVS DEI Committee members to put together a program that donates caps, goggles and team suits to members of underprivileged high school swim teams. There are several high school swimmers in the DMV that are currently sharing goggles and caps and wearing make-shift suits.

- The goal is to sponsor at least one high school team in 2022-2023 and several teams in the future.
- DEI Day Camp
 - The goal of this camp is to offer classroom and pool sessions for athletes of diverse ethnicity and/or athletes who identify with the LGBTQ+ community. We would like to also offer a day camp to athletes with disabilities. We would like enough support for this camp to offer it to the athletes without any cost.

- Please remember to check the Ethnicity Box for your athletes (or encourage families to do so) when registering for the upcoming season. Having accurate data on our membership helps those in PVS and USA Swimming identify trends in demographics and align support and resources appropriately.
- PVS/USA Swimming Outreach Membership Status
 - Athletes who qualify for outreach membership are fully reimbursed for meet entry fees at all PVS sponsored meets. They also receive up to a 50% reduction on zone team registration fees and only pay \$5 for a USA Swimming premium membership.

USA Swimming National & Regional Diversity Select Camp

USA Swimming offers both a National (applicants from all four zones are 0 accepted and swimmers are selected from those applications) and Regional (applicants are accepted and selected from designated Zones/LSC's) camp experience for high performing athletes that represent an underrepresented community and/or an ethnically underrepresented population that is less than 10% of the current USA Swimming membership. These populations can include African American/Black, Hispanic/Latinx, Asian or Pacific Islander, Native American and others. Other athletes may be accepted if they represent another underrepresented demographic (e.g., LGBTO+). The goal of these camps is to empower athletes from diverse backgrounds and underrepresented populations to demonstrate the viability of multicultural success in swimming, achieve performance excellence at every level of the sport, expound the benefits and value of participating in the sport of swimming and be positive leaders and role models that others from multicultural backgrounds can emulate.

- Please encourage your athletes to apply for these camps if they meet the requirements (applications can be found on <u>USA Swimming's camp page</u>).
