### PVS House of Delegates Officials Committee Report May 21, 2007

### Organization

The Committee consists of 18 members and ex-officio members, two members left this year. The Committee is currently engaged in a review of the mission and goals of the Committee to identify any organizational or operational changes that might be appropriate to better serve the officials and swimmer of PVS. The Committee held four meeting this year.

#### Officials

Clinics: This year we conducted twenty one clinics, (see attached list for sites and dates) and **207 attendees\***. This is slightly less than last year but still s respectable attendance figure. The number for S&T does not include officials who attended approved summer league sessions.

There are currently 291 certified officials with a valid certification through CY 2008, this represents an increase of 37 officials from last year. The website certification data for officials is updated through May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

### **Other Activities**

The Committee continues to provide PVS shirts to officials after two years of working meets. This has been extremely popular and you will see many officials in their shirts at meets. We continue to provide Bells to new starters, also a popular item

The Committee carefully reviewed and established a protocol for Chase Starts this year.

PVS Officials Boots Hall, John Hirschmann and Don Riedlinger have been selected to work the 2008 Olympic Trials in Omaha, Nebraska

The Committee introduced an Officials Newsletter developed and edited by Committee member Jack Neill this year and published three editions. All are available on the PVS Website and a copy is included in the Appendix of this report.

Committee member Jack Neill also compiled and wrote a Timing Judge manual, a complete copy of which is available on the PVS Website

We sent two "new referees" to the Officials Training Workshop conducted by USA Swimming in St Louis Missouri in 2007. Peter Nichols and Lionel Bejean represented PVS.

Committee member Jim Thompson continues to refine and improve an Excel Spreadsheet to allow the Meet Referee from each PVS sanctioned meet to capture the names of each Official who worked, the Meet, actual session(s) and position (s) worked. Final data for this season is attached.

Officials Committee Chair Jim Van Erden attended the USA Swimming Officials Chair's annual meeting in San Antonio on June 14-16, 2007.

This year four meets were approved for National Certification: N2 level certification (PVS Senior Champs and PVS 14 & Under Champs), and N2/N3 (PVS Senior LC Champs and Tom Dolan Invitational). The PVS Senior Champs and 14 & Under Champs had 47 and approximately 70 officials who participated.

In honor of Boots Hall receiving the Maxwell Award and with the support of the PVS Board, the Committee held a reception to honor Boots and to recognize a number of PVS Officials for their outstanding contributions to PVS and our swimmers. The following PVS Officials were awarded 2007-2008 Outstanding Contribution Awards by Potomac Valley Swimming at the Officials Recognition Reception on April 26, 2008:

A coach tells you that his swimmer has sprained an ankle and is unable to turn his foot out in the breaststroke kick. The coach says that, because of this sprained ankle, the swimmer should be considered disabled. Should the swimmer be disqualified for not turning his foot out in the propulsive part of the kick, or is he excused because of a disability? See the answer at the bottom of this newsletter.

## Feature Article: "Making My First Call" by Jim Thompson

I started my officiating career in the mid-1990s as a timer. After about two seasons of working as a timer and observing the folks "in white" (at that time), I decided that I could become an official. Actually, the thing that got me over the decision to become a certified official is that the uniform changed from "all white" to the current "white top over navy blue pants". I figured with the "white over navy blue," I did not look like the Pillsbury Dough Boy or the blimp monster from the first Ghost Buster movie. :-)

I still remember my first time on deck as an apprentice stroke and turn official. I was perspiring even more than the temperature warranted. I remember working with a senior official during that session. He was very helpful and helped me to feel more comfortable on deck.

Even though I could not write-up a DQ, he wanted me to raise my hand when I saw a disqualification. When I raised my hand the first time, I remember my heart rate going up

to at least a thousand beats per minute. And I'm sure when I described the DQ to that senior official it came out sounding like, "um...the swimmer sort of did...this...um...kind of thing with his arms...that...um...did not look right...so I think it is a DQ. You should write it up." Luckily for my officiating career, even though I must have sounded like I never been to a meet before, he had faith in me and encouraged me to keep at it.

Over time I got better at describing the infractions and being able to write to the rules. It is one of those things that get easier with practice. I found working different kinds of meets, especially mini-meets, allowed me to see all types of infractions and the opportunity to practice verbally describing the infraction.

In the next installment, I'll talk about my "first coach initiated discussion".

# **Resolution to 'You Make the Call'**

The swimmer should be DQ'ed. A sprained ankle does not qualify as a disability, which is defined in Article 105.1.1 as "a permanent physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities." No exception to the breaststroke rule is warranted in this situation.
